Teaching

2015-Present. Siena College, Loudonville, NY.

Basic Design 1 Hands on studio art course offered to students with a variety of majors. The course focuses on the principles and elements of design and offers diverse artist examples to prompt connections between materials, processes and metaphorical ideas. Students are encouraged to experiment with an array of media including gouache, acrylics, ink, and air drying clay with creative problem solving the goal to best meet the requirements for each assignment. Reinvigorated existing curriculum to include color theory and three dimensional design concepts.

Introduction to Visual Arts Updated curriculum for a lecture survey art course that goes well beyond the canon. This course focuses on the history, culture and ideas of art, through the lens of contemporary art. To assist students with little prior experience or knowledge of art, the course is taught using a "rhizomatic" system that encourages students to make connections between artist ideas, processes and materials. A snapshot of class time includes brief thematic presentations, students working in small groups to analyze class information, followed up with brief group and individual presentations.

Art in a Carceral State Created and taught this new course after receiving a Summer Pedagogy Fellowship from Siena College in 2021 in collaboration with the new Criminal Justice program. This course examines the historical, cultural and political legacy of our current state of mass incarceration through the lens of art. By exploring contemporary themes and practices in art including art made by currently and formerly incarcerated artists, students engage in a variety of hands-on art making to explore the limitations of making art behind bars. The course includes multiple guest artists and speakers working with justice impacted artists.

2015-2020 Columbia County Jail, Hudson, NY. Art programming for men and women in partnership with ReEntry Columbia. Projects include 2-D collage, paint, and clay works with the intent of using art processes to relieve stress and foster personal expression.

2017 Roarke Center, Troy NY. Summer Collaboration with teaching artist/sculptor Madison LaVallee and photographer Jason van Staveren to create socially engaged programming for Roarke Center participants. Project culminated in an exhibition at the Troy Center for the arts titled Our Place, with a public engagement event at the opening.

2016 Brookwood Secure Center, Hudson, NY. Summer High School Art teacher for 14-19 year old boys. Created curriculum that included, painting, print making, drawing, and clay, using limited materials/tools allowed within the restrictions of the facility.

2014 Chatham Elementary School. Created art programming for Kid's Club, a summer program for children 5-12 years old in conjunction with Art School of Columbia County, using a grant from Berkshire Taconic Foundation. Projects dovetailed with Kid's Club themes including the environment, farm to table, and culminated with a completely children-run carnival.

Created a wire sculpture workshop for children titled Enabling Your Abilities, where children reverse engineered computer equipment to create a wearable artwork that would give them "super powers." This project was originally developed while teaching college students at University of Albany and adapted for this younger audience.
